

- 2. To provide a stage for the formulation of a national blue carbon strategy focused on conserving the 'bioshield' functions of these 'blue carbon' ecosystems.



## **Participation**

The figure below tells us the story of the participants; who, from where, & how they participated. Ninety-two joined and shared with us their expertise & experiences via 21 & 13 oral and poster presentations, respectively. They came from 12 of the 17 regions in the country, & two participants even came from Indonesia and Japan. Forty-five institutions were represented, comprising the government, NGO, private, and academic sectors. For reasons unknown to us, 32 were males & 60 were females. Interesting!
